

The Grade 5 residential was a memorable and enriching experience



The Grade 5 residential was a memorable and enriching experience, during which our students spent two nights away from home developing independence, resilience and teamwork. Over three days, they explored Birkat Al Mawz, Tanuf, Al Hoota Caves, Misfat, Bait Al Safa, Jabreen Castle and the Oman Across Ages Museum, engaging thoughtfully with expert guides and asking insightful questions about Omani heritage and history.

The children struck a wonderful balance between being kids — enjoying camp life, games and shared experiences — and listening carefully to instructions, following routines and fully engaging with the learning whilst on the guided tours. From setting up tents with surprising efficiency to cultural exploration, they demonstrated maturity, curiosity and respect throughout.

The staff are extremely proud of how the students represented themselves and the school, returning with lasting memories and a real sense of personal growth for each one of them.





Victorian Showcase

On Tuesday 16th, Grade 5 stepped back in time and entered our Victorian Living Museum, where learning came to life through the voices and confidence of our students. For our Parental Showcase Day, the atrium was transformed into an interactive exhibition, with children taking centre stage as curators, historians and educators.

Each child became a living exhibit, proudly showcasing their knowledge of Victorian schools, workhouses and education, alongside explorations of William Morris' art and design, Victorian inventions, and traditional toys. Parents were invited to move freely around the space, engaging with exhibits led entirely by the students themselves.

Throughout the day, students also immersed themselves in Victorian-themed activities and delighted in dressing up as Victorians, which added authenticity, excitement and a strong sense of historical immersion to the experience.

More than a display of historical understanding, the afternoon celebrated the development of vital soft skills. Students confidently presented information, asked thoughtful questions, and quizzed parents to check their understanding—demonstrating articulation, collaboration and independence in action.

This student-led experience highlighted not only the depth of learning taking place in the classroom, but also the confidence, curiosity and ownership our learners brought to their education. It was a joyful celebration of knowledge, creativity and communication—truly history brought to life.

Updated Mobile Phone Policy

Following some recent feedback we have decided to review our mobile phone policy to ensure that it is in line with best practice and Omani legislation. Our expectations remain the same, but we have made changes to the in-school consequences. We ask that parents support this policy and prevent their child(ren) from bringing their mobile phones to school.



Expectations

Students must not bring mobile phones to school.

If a phone is genuinely needed for travel or safety reasons, it must be handed in to reception or the Phase Leader at the start of the day and collected at home time.

Any phone seen or heard during the school day (between 7:30am and 3:00pm) will be treated as a breach of the zero-tolerance policy.

After 15:00 phones can be collected and used briefly in the atrium to contact parents/drivers, beyond this staff will instruct student to put their phones away.

Rationale

Being phone free helps everyone focus on learning. It keeps everyone safe online and in school and makes school a friendly, distraction-free place for all students.

Exceptions

Should there be a particular reason that a student requires a phone in school (e.g. monitoring blood sugar levels for diabetes) the parents should inform the phase leader by email who will ensure that all staff are aware of the specific conditions of this exception.



Updated Mobile Phone Policy


